


Front Entrance Decoration

B. In the front yard of the residential premises provided it is at least 10 feet from the house side of a street curb or the edge of paving of the street where no curb exists and no closer than 7 feet from any other property line.

Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions, such vehicles may be parked on a residential premise for a period of time not exceeding 72 hours for the purposes of loading, unloading or performing routine maintenance.


There are currently at least 11 cell towers located in Hampden Township, most being either 120 or 150 foot tall. There is a 120 foot tower at Creekview Park if anyone wants to get a general visual sense of the height involved.

The Zoning Hearing Board will be holding a hear-ing on this request on Wednesday, February 15th, at 7:30 PM at the Hampden Township Building. All Pine Brook residents, either in favor or opposed to the zoning variance and resulting construction of the cell tower, may want to consider attending this hearing. The Zoning Hearing Board can make the final decision for the Township at this meeting, or it can take up to 45 days to render a final decision. **The Zoning Hearing Board will be the final deci-sion maker for approval or denial of these vari-ance requests.**
