

## BITS AND PIECES

#### Please don't block sidewalks

Hampden Township code requires the owner of households to "keep the sidewalk, together with any portion of the property paved and used as a sidewalk or public walk immediately in front of his property, in good order and repair, and at all times free and clear of all obstructions to safe and convenient passage." This means individuals can not block the sidewalk with vehicles and owners must repair any sections damaged or pushed up by tree roots.

#### **Pet Peeves**

Some residents would like to remind everyone that the Township does have "pooper-scooper" laws and you must clean up after your pets. This includes the common areas of the neighborhood such as Hidden Park and Pavilion Park.

Not picking up after your pets is a violation of Township laws and the penalty for not picking up after your dog is a fine of no more than \$600 and/or jail time of no more than 30 days.

# **Spiral Path Farms**

For the sixth year, The Plank family will be a Spiral Path Farm Organic Produce volunteer host. Spiral Path Farm is an organic farm in Perry County. Through Spiral Path, you can take part in their Community Supported Agriculture program whereby, for a membership fee, you will receive a box of fresh, locally grown organic produce once a week from mid April through mid December.

There are several different membership programs with a variety of "subscription" dates and box sizes. Boxes of produce can be picked up every Thursday at our house at 3807 Candlelight Drive. Several members in our neighborhood "split" a share and alternate pick-up weeks.

We receive no money from Spiral Path Farm; we are simply a volunteer drop-off/pick-up site for the produce.


## **Tuesdays at the Pavilion**

## **Orrs Bridge replacement**

On January 22, 2015, Hampden Township held a public presentation on the plans of the Orrs Bridge replacement project. Pine Brook resident Ted Greiner attended the meeting and provided a recap to the neighborhood on the email listsery.

The new bridge will be a gentle curve arching downstream from the current bridge. This will allow for easier access to the bridge while driving.



At this time, it is unclear exactly how the new bridge will impact the front entrance of Pine Brook, but it is possible the neighborhood will lose the stone wall to the right side of Lamp Post Lane as you enter the neighborhood.

Construction may start in Fall 2016 and, for the most part, will not impede traffic. There will be at least three weeks when the current bridge will be closed. Traffic will be routed down Orrs Bridge Road to Creekview Road to Good Hope Road to Carlisle Pike.
