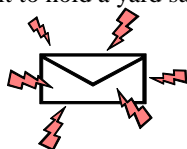

There are two different membership programs. Boxes of produce can be picked up every Wednesday at our house at 3807 Candlelight Drive.

We receive no money from Spiral Path Farm; we are simply a volunteer drop-off/pick-up site for the produce.

## PBCA Directory Art Contest

Artwork will have to fit within a print space of 4 inches wide by 4 1/2 inches high. Original art can be larger - but we'll scan and reduce the size. Artists should know that if the art is too large, or the detail too small – if we have to shrink the artwork, those details may be hard to see in the final cover version. Artwork must be flat. We will have to scan the original for inclusion on the Directory, so it absolutely must be flat. Paintings, drawings, collages, etc., are great as long as they are flat.



Artwork must somehow represent the Pine Brook neighborhood. This may include the parks, creek, trees, general view of homes, and nonspecific images of people.

Entries must be submitted by May 31, 2010, to Wayne Kessler, 211 Lamp Post Lane. The cover selection will be determined by the PBCA Board at the following board meeting. All artwork will be returned to the artists if names and addresses are provided. We will provide reference of the winner in our newsletter and in the directory. Identity of the winner will be specified in accordance with the wishes of the artist, parents of the artist and the PBCA Board.

## PBCA HersheyPark Group Sales

Want to save money taking the family to HersheyPark? If enough Pine Brook residents are interested, then Pine Brook will qualify for lower price "group sales" one-day tickets to HersheyPark. **THE DEADLINE IS APRIL 18, 2010.**

We need to buy at least 20 tickets total (which are good for any day during the 2010 season) and they must be paid for in advance. You can buy as many as you like for whomever you want. Plus, this year you can get meal vouchers, 2-for-1 game tickets, Really Big 3D movie tickets, The Hershey Story Museum tickets and Hershey Garden tickets at discounted prices.

HersheyPark One Day Tickets Group Sale Prices:

Adult (ages 9-54) are \$29.00 (normally \$53)

Youth (3-8) are \$24.50 (normally \$32)

Senior (55-69) are \$24.50 (normally \$32)

Senior Plus (ages 70+) are \$19.95 (normally \$21)

House Specialty meal vouchers \$12.75 (see below for details)

HersheyPark 2-for-1 game tickets \$2

Hershey's Really Big 3D show \$4 (normally \$6)

The Hershey Story Museum \$5.50 (normally \$10 adults, \$9 seniors, \$7.50 kids)

Hershey Gardens \$5 (normally \$10 adults, \$9 seniors, \$7 kids)

The "House Specialty Meal" is a meal at one of the park's participating food venues within HersheyPark. You get an entrée, side and a 2010 souvenir cup beverage with 99¢ refills all season long. You can get as many meal vouchers, 2-1 game, 3D movie, museum or garden tickets as you would like. Note: If you do not use your ticket during the 2010 regular season, you can trade it in at FULL FACE VALUE towards a ticket for the next year. Meaning, the adult one day ticket you buy now for \$29 will be worth \$53 towards a 2011 ticket should you not use it in 2010.

These one day tickets also qualify for HersheyPark's "Pre-view Plan." This means you can use these tickets to go to the park the 3 hours before the park closes the evening BEFORE you plan to use the tickets. Example: You can go Friday evening for free AND still use the same tickets all day Saturday.
