For those who need the information, a call to the police at **761-2609** may be used to report violators. Not picking up after your dog could result in a fine of up to \$600 and/or jail time of up to 30 days.

Pet Peeves

Some residents would like to remind everyone that the Township does have "pooper-scooper" laws and you must clean up after your pets. This includes the common areas of the neighborhood such as Hidden Park and Pavilion Park.

Not picking up after your pets is a violation of Township laws and the penalty for not picking up after your dog is a fine of no more than \$600 and/or jail time of no more than 30 days.


