Pet Peeves

Some residents would like to remind everyone that the Township does have "pooper-scooper" laws and you must clean up after your pets. This includes the common areas of the neighborhood such as Hidden Park and Pavilion Park.

Not picking up after your pets is a violation of Township laws and the penalty for not picking up after your dog is a fine of no more than \$600 and/or jail time of no more than 30 days.

The PBCA also allows interested adults or businesses to advertise in the neighborhood newsletter for a small charge. The cost is \$25 for a business card size ad. New Trash Cans

The residents of Pine Brook have all received brand new trash cans recently. One is for trash and the other is for recyclables.

The new trashcans are designed to be picked up by an automated system. To ensure the truck's mechanical arm can work properly, please make sure your trash cans are placed on or behind the curb line of your yard and with the metal rod facing the street.

According to the Township, trash can not be placed on your curb for collection before 6:00 p.m. on the night before trash is to be picked up. For most weeks, this means Monday night after 6:00 p.m.

Orrs Bridge Replacement

The county is planning to replace Orrs Bridge sometime in the future. The plans are currently calling for the new bridge to be built next to the existing bridge. However, the exact plans for the location of the new bridge have not yet been decided. It is possible Pine Brook will lose part of Front Park and our front entrance wall depending on how the bridge is to be built.

The planning, permits, funding, etc. for the new bridge is expected to be finished by 2015. There is still time for your voice to be heard. Construction on the new bridge may be finished by 2017. All of these plans may be pushed back depending on many factors. We'll have to keep an eye on what happens.

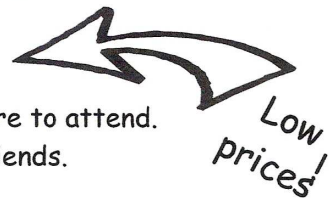
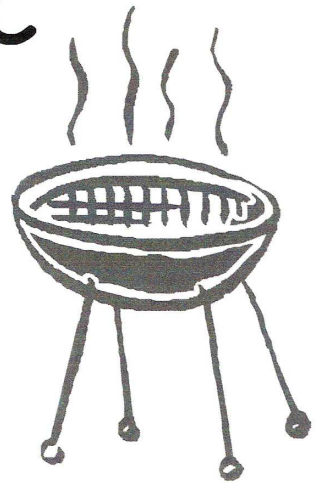

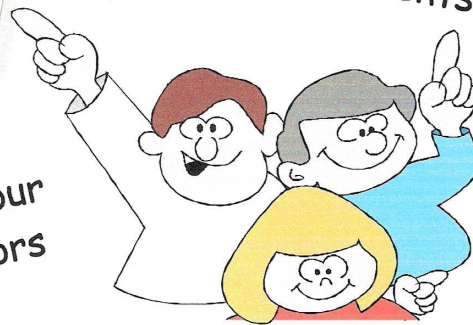
