

BSA Hornaday Award Projects

Eagle Scout Billy Fish of Troop 80 is working towards earning the William T. Hornaday Silver Medal which is the Boy Scouts' highest honor for conservation work. With help from Pine Brook residents and scouts from Troop 80 and Troop 196, Billy organized the installation of 238 storm drain markers in the Pine Brook, Silver Brook and Kingswood neighborhoods.

On **Saturday, September 10**, Billy will need volunteers to clean up a 2.1 mile section of the Conodoguinet Creek. The cleanup will begin at the East Pennsboro Township Recreation Area off of Acri Road and end at Pine Brook's Front Park. Volunteers will walk upstream in the creek and collect trash. Food and refreshments will be provided to volunteers.

The rain date for this event is September 24.

Coming up in late September, there will be a seminar on hydraulic fracturing at the Cumberland Valley High School that Billy will be coordinating. Free and open to the public.

For his final Hornaday project, Billy will start a battery recycling project throughout the entire CV School District so residents can dispose of used single use and rechargeable batteries.
